**SOUTHAMPTON driver Shelley Jory claimed three victories during the Powerboat Week at Lake Windermere.**

The bridal shop owner, pictured left, along with co-driver and partner Pete Berrow, pushed her Honda Formula 4 Stroke 225hp power boat Team Raymarine to the limit to win the class race. Buoyed up by their success, the pair then won both the two-hour and three-hour endurance races. Finally, the endurance

record set by Jory at the 2003 event remained untouched - leaving her the holder of the V24 one, two and three-hour endurance records.

Jory was one of only a few drivers who drove for the full three hours, and was the only female competitor to take part in the whole event.

Team Raymarine is fully kitted out with Raymarine's navigational equipment, including the C70 multifunction display, radio, ST 60 Graphic and 120 GPS. Jory and Berrow's outstanding achievement was recorded on the Raymarine marine electronics equipment

fitted on board, which showed the pair raced at an average of 55 miles per hour during the three-hour endurance record race.

Jory said: "Having clear, easy-to-read electronics on board helped us enormously during the endurance racing.

"It's really hard to maintain such fast speeds, while racing against other boats, for three hours. Having the vital data presented to us, in easy-to-see and understand formats, we could focus on the racing and were less mentally tired than we would have been without such a well equipped boat."
