# Warne working to keep Clark longer



**HAMPSHIRE are hoping to extend Stuart Clark's stay at the Rose Bowl.**

Clark took 7-82, the best figures by a Hampshire bowler for six years, during the rain-affected draw against Lancashire last week.

They were the 31-year-old's best figures in the championship.

His previous best haul was the 5-61 he took in one of his 12 appearances for Middlesex in 2005, but after Clark's efforts in his second outing for Hampshire, Shane Warne is hoping to extend his compatriot's stay beyond June 20.

That is when Clark is due to return to Australia and, if he was to leave then, it would mean the fast bowler has already played his last championship home game of his stint.

He is due to play three more championship games for the county - all away from home against Kent at Canterbury, Warwickshire at Edgbaston and Sussex at Arundel.

Warne said: "At the moment

we've got Stuey for three more away games. It would have been nice to have him bowling again at the Rose Bowl but if we play our cards right we might be able to persuade him to stay for the whole year.

"Obviously there are a lot of things that come into it. It's also about what Cricket Australia want, but at the end of the day if he feels he is better off preparing for the Australian summer with us we need to do what's right for Stuart Clark."

Director of cricket Tim Tremlett confirmed yesterday that Hampshire's contact with Cricket Australia regarding Clark's availability is an "ongoing process".

Australia do not play in either form of the game until September, when the one-day series against Zimbabwe may not even go ahead.

John Howard, the Australian Prime Minister yesterday ruled out any chance of Australia touring Zimbabwe but the series may yet be played at a neutral venue.

Hampshire and Lancashire

settled for a draw after playing for bonus points at the Rose Bowl on Saturday.

After Lancashire resumed on 156-9, Clark took the last four wickets as they were dismissed for 207 before Dimitri Mascarenhas made a brisk 74, his highest championship score for two seasons.

John Crawley (40) and Chris Benham (46) also impressed against an attack including the England trio of James Anderson, Sajid Mahmood and Andrew Flintoff.

Anderson and Mahmood both took three wickets before hands were shaken when Hampshire were bowled out for 272.

Shane Warne and Lancashire captain Mark Chilton had a now infamous fall-out in the corresponding fixture on the final day of last season, when the latter refused to set Hampshire a target to chase.

Although the circumstances were different following the loss of 261.2 overs to rain during this match, Warne admitted he had again discussed setting up a possible run chase with Chilton this morning.

The Hampshire captain said: "It was disappointing not to set up a finish, both of us would have liked to have got a game going but there were a few issues we couldn't agree on so unfortunately it didn't eventuate and it was just a points game."

"To have had four full days with the sun shining would have been fantastic but it wasn't to be, which was a shame for everybody."

"But Freddie Flintoff still had a good workout. I'm sure he'd have liked to have got rid of a few more cobwebs but he looked fantastic with the bat and bowled quick."

## Aussie stars boost Shelley's flying start

**SOUTHAMPTON** powerboat queen Shelley Jory is copying Australia's Ashes and World Cup winning cricketers to give Team Raymarine a flying start to the new powerboat season.

The Honda Formula Four Stroke Series kicked off in Torquay at the weekend and Jory, 37, has been tuning up for the racing in sports gear favoured by the likes of Brett Lee and Andrew Symonds.

It helped her clock up a sixth-placed finish in the H4FS 225hp Series 12-lap race in Team Raymarine along with co-driver Libby Keir.

Jory's rigorous pre-season fitness schedule, devised by personal trainer James Seilo, has been enhanced following a tie-up with Skins, the Australian-based manufacturers of compression therapeutic garments.

Independent scientific and medical research is said to have proved that Skins with BioAcceleration technology improve circulation, increase oxygen delivery to the muscles, help eliminate lactic acids and other metabolic waste.

"The exercises, coupled with wearing Skins, have helped me get into great shape for the new season and ready to cope with its physical demands."

Tempestuous Torquay weather put competitors skills to the test as Torbay played host to the opening round of the 2007 Honda Formula 4-Stroke Powerboat Series. Despite temperamental

weather conditions thousands of spectators turned up in Torquay to watch the world's largest offshore powerboat series.

After a seven-year absence, Torquay made a welcome return to the race calendar where the series celebrated its 75th round. Two action packed races wowed the local Devon crowd as competitors contended with varying conditions when calm Saturday morning waters turned into stormy seas.

In a thrilling 150hp race, Neil Crabb and Lee Darbyshire in 'Premier Cru' took the chequered flag in emphatic style setting an impressive average speed of 46.31mph despite the challenging conditions.

In the closely fought 225hp race, father and son team Rhys and Haydn Evans battled it out with local boys Gavin Parsonage and Nathan Libby.

"It was very rough out there and I'm certain everybody had a hairy moment or two at some point during the race," said Evans.
